1. Opening Prayer

Elder Barnes led the Council in an opening prayer.

2. Welcome

Chair Jordan Coble thanked everyone for coming to the IEC meeting. The Chair shared that OKIB recently elected a new Chief and Council who appointed OKIB Councillors Peggy Joe and Allan Louis to the IEC table. The OKIB representatives were welcomed to the IEC. The Chair reminded the IEC of the importance of acknowledging that we are on the territory of the syilx nation and that it takes a community of people to protect the waters, the salmon, and the children so they grow strong and healthy. Council members introduced themselves.

3. Adoption of the May 7, 2025 Agenda

MOVED by Allan Louis, SECONDED by Nicole Werstuik THAT: The agenda for May 7, 2025 be adopted as presented. CARRIED

4. <u>2025/2026 Indigenous Education Program Preliminary Budget Update and Indigenous Education</u> Program Staffing

Jesse Bruce, Director of Instruction – Indigenous Education and Equity, provided a short review of the 2025/2026 Preliminary Indigenous Education Budget that was presented, discussed and approved by the Council at the February 4, 2025 IEC Budget meeting. The preliminary budget presented to the IEC in February included the anticipated surplus of \$49,893, down from \$561,000 the previous year. At the February 4th IEC meeting, the Council approved the following remedies to balance the resulting budget pressure:

- Remove Indigenous Cultural Presenters (2 FTE to 0 FTE)
- Reduce Indigenous Student Advocate allotment (54 FTE to 51.4) (currently 49 FTE Advocates are staffed in schools)
- Reduce Middle School Indigenous Success Teachers (1.5 FTE to 1.2 FTE) (resulting in 0.5 FTE reduced to 0.4 FTE at three schools)
- Reduce Early Learning Teacher Consultants (2 FTE to 1 FTE)
- Reduce Clerical Support (1.57 FTE to 1.4 FTE)
 (55 hours/week reduced to 52.5 hours/week between two staff members)
- Minor reductions in various General Program expenses

Since the February 4th IEC Budget meeting, the Ministry of Education and Child Care announced that the per pupil funding will be increased by \$20 per Indigenous student for the 2025/2026 school year. In addition, the Indigenous Education Department has also found savings within the budget. The net result is an anticipated increase in the Targeted Funding surplus to \$156,157.

The Chair led the IEC members in a round-table discussion about how to best utilize the expected 2025-2026 Indigenous Education Targeted Funding surplus of \$156,157.

The IEC spoke about the need to clarify what Targeted Funding can be spent on; the possibility of investing in a Junior Advocate Program; the role of the Indigenous Cultural Presenter; the process of booking cultural presentations by the schools, and the cost sharing of cultural presentations between the schools and the District; the need for lunch-time and after-school programs at specific schools, and the implications of the CUPE Collective Agreement on staff wages when considering an after-school program; the need for more direct services for the Indigenous students in schools; the role of the Indigenous Student Advocate; the importance of providing enough wellness support for the Advocates; and, the need for an additional Lead Advocate to mentor and support the Advocates.

THAT: The Indigenous Education Council support the reinstatement of one Indigenous Cultural Presenter position, explore the opportunity for an additional Lead Indigenous Student Advocate position, and use the balance of the surplus to start exploring an Afterschool program and a Junior Advocate program. CARRIED
